

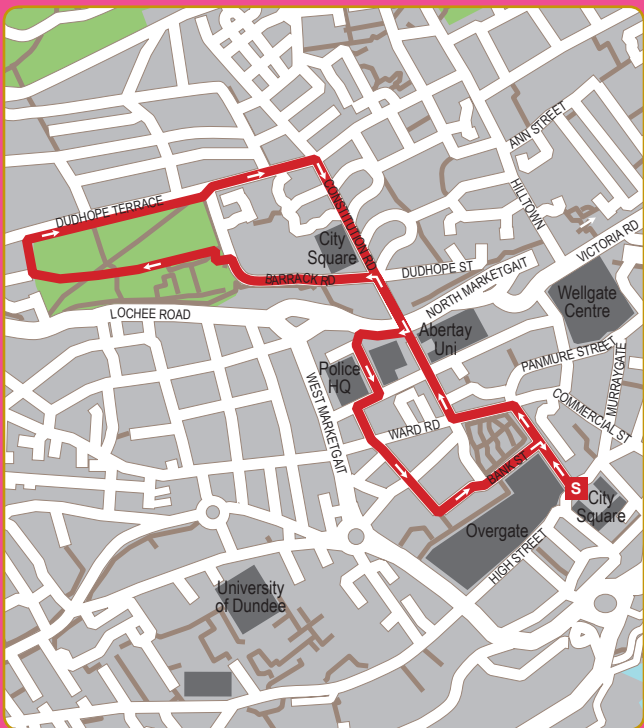
City Centre & Dudhope Park

Directions

Starting at City Square, walk up to the end of Reform Street and turn left. Cross over the road at the pedestrian crossing and walk along Meadowside to Constitution Road on your right. Turn up Constitution Road and walk up past the University Library. After the library follow the path around to left and you will find an underpass that allows you to continue up Constitution Road at the other side. The next road on your left is Barrack Road; follow this round to Dudhope Park.

Turn left at the small building into Dudhope Park and walk ahead toward the exit onto Dudhope Terrace. Stay in the park but walk back along the path in the park running parallel to Dudhope Terrace. Exit the park and cross Infirmary Road and continue along Somerville Place until you reach the top of Constitution Road. Turn right onto Constitution Road. If you cross over to the left-hand side of the road you can walk down Union Terrace, Prospect Place and Laurel Bank, before continuing back down Constitution Road to the underpass.

Turn right after coming through the underpass, and follow the path round behind the car park and left towards West Bell Street. Turn right onto West Bell Street and then take then next left. Follow this road down, and turn left onto Bank Street. Walk along Bank Street until you reach Reform Street and finally City Square.

Points of interest

- Dudhope Castle served as barracks between the 1790s and 1880, and then again during the First and Second World Wars.
- Sir Robert Watson Watt, the inventor of Radar, lodged in Constitution Road.
