SOUTH MARKETGAIT EAST DOCK STREET BROUGHTY FERRY ROAD RECONSTRUCTION


Transport Scotland and Dundee City Council are to resurface and reconstruct East Dock Street (A92) between Commercial Street and Greendykes Road. The work is due to start on 8 September 2009 and last around 10 weeks. This represents an investment of £1.8m from Transport Scotland and £1m from Dundee City Council

Traffic lights will be installed at Trades Lane and the exit from City Quay will be re-built as part of the Central Waterfront redevelopment.

The temporary traffic management plan has been designed to keep the duration of the works to a minimum whilst safeguarding the travelling public and the workforce. Delay and disruption to motorists are unfortunately inevitable. Travellers are encouraged to consider public transport as an alternative.

There will be essentially two phases of work. This leaflet gives essential details of the traffic management arrangements during each phase although additional measures, particularly at night, may be required. Drivers should obey the appropriate diversion signing.

Vehicular and pedestrian access to adjacent properties and businesses will generally be maintained at all times but short term closures may be necessary in agreement with owner/occupiers.



DURING THE FIRST PHASE (Weeks 1 to 6)

One lane will be maintained westbound at all times between East Marketgait and City Quay roundabout. South Marketgait will be closed to eastbound traffic at City Quay roundabout and traffic from the Tay Road Bridge wishing to travel to East Dock Street will be diverted clockwise along the Inner Ring Road.

One lane of traffic in both the east and westbound directions will be maintained between East Marketgait and Market Street.

There will be no access to the Tay Road Bridge or City Quay from East Marketgait. Traffic will be diverted from East Port roundabout, anti-clockwise around the Inner Ring Road.

PEDESTRIANS

The pedestrian phases on the traffic signals at East Marketgait / East Dock Street / South Marketgait and East Dock Street / Gallagher Retail Park will be switched off.

The existing Pelican crossing on South Marketgait near Arnold Clark will be replaced with a temporary one while work is carried out there.

The Pelican crossing on East Marketgait will be operating to enable city-centre pedestrians to access the retail park.

GALLAGHER RETAIL PARK

To ease traffic flow, the East Marketgait and Gallagher Retail Park traffic signals will be switched off for the duration of Phase I. Traffic wishing to enter the park will access via East Port roundabout/ East Marketgait and exit eastwards along to either Market Street or Broughty Ferry Road.

Access to the retail park will be maintained during the day, but the main access will be closed on some nights (7.30pm to 6.30am) to allow East Dock Street and the access itself to be reconstructed. During these times users of the retail park can use the East Whale Lane car park.

During this phase it will not be possible to turn right from East Marketgait nor Gallagher Retail Park onto East Dock Street or into Gallagher Retail Park from East Dock Street.

CITY QUAY

Access to and exit from City Quay will be maintained at all times from City Quay roundabout.

TRADES LANE / COMMERCIAL STREET / GELLATLY STREET

To minimise delays on the Tay Road Bridge, traffic is encouraged to use both slip roads into Dundee. To minimise congestion in the city centre it will be necessary to ban manoeuvres from City Quay roundabout to the Commercial/Gellatly Street area.

Access to this area will be maintained at all times from Seagate but there will be no through access to South Marketgait.

DURING THE SECOND PHASE (Weeks 6 to 10)

One lane of traffic in both the east and westbound directions will be maintained between Market Street and Greendykes Road between the hours of 6.30am and 7.30pm.

Two lanes will be provided in each direction between City Quay roundabout and Market Street.

The traffic signals at Gallagher Retail Park and East Marketgait will operate as normal during this phase with no restrictions on manoeuvres or access/ egress.

The traffic signals at Greendykes Road will remain in operation, but the approaches will be restricted to one lane.
