

GOLF MEMBERSHIP SCHEME - TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1) The Golf Season

The golf season runs from the 1st April to the following 31st March.

2) Conditions of Issue

- a) The Card is valid for either, or both of the 18 hole courses at Caird Park and Camperdown.
- b) National Entitlement Cards are issued to all current members. The card will need to be produced whenever the cardholder wishes to gain access to the course. Only the cardholder may take advantage of the National Entitlement Card, it is not transferable. Use of the card by any person other than the cardholder will result in the cancellation of the membership without refund.
- c) All cards must be shown to the Golf Course Starter prior to play and must be carried during play along with any other temporary ticket which may have been purchased from the Starter.
- d) All membership cards must be available for inspection by an authorised employee of Dundee City Council. If during play the card is found in possession of any person other than the person to whom it has been issued, full payment at the visitors single round rate will be required and the card shall be forfeited.
- e) The membership gives no starting priority.
- f) Lost/stolen or damaged cards should be reported to Customer Services, Floor 2, Tayside House, Dundee as soon as possible, as the card issuer, Dundee City Council, reserves the right to introduce an administration fee for this service.
- g) The rules of the course must be adhered to at all times. Course rules are displayed at the individual golf courses.
- h) If there are any changes to the cardholders details (e.g. address, surname) Dundee City Council must be notified as early as possible. It is the responsibility of the cardholder to provide Dundee City Council with the correct information and required authentication documents whereupon a new card will be issued.
- i) Dundee City Council will not be responsible for the loss of information stored upon the card and will not be liable for any mistakes and/or omissions made by the card holder at any time.
- j) Dundee City Council reserves the right to withdraw/amend any service on the card/membership.
- k) All data collected is in accordance with the Data Protection Act 1998.

3) Payment

- a) Payment for all memberships, can be made in full when applying or through the Council's Direct Debit Payment System. Applicants wishing to use this method must complete the Direct Debit form which is attached, and return it with the Application Form to the Golf Starter or Customer Services, Floor 2, Tayside House, Dundee.
- b) When using the Direct Debit System option the first monthly instalment will be made in cash at the time of application, with the balance being deducted in monthly instalments (see table).
- c) Anyone joining the Direct Debit Scheme will be required to pay the relevant fees for the remaining duration of the current golf season.
- d) Any member who no longer meets the criteria for holding a concession priced ticket must notify the Leisure and Communities Department and transfer on to the standard rate equivalent membership immediately.
- e) In the first year of membership one months notice in writing is required to terminate the membership. Fee's due for the remainder of the current season shall be payable.
- f) In subsequent, continuous years of membership, one months notice in writing is required to terminate the membership.
- g) Members may not be permitted to utilise the Direct Debit System for 12 months once leaving it.
- h) Memberships paid using Direct Debit will be automatically renewed in April each year, unless notification of termination is received.
- g) Any increase in membership fees will be notified one month in advance of the increase being applied.

4) Unpaid or Outstanding Balances

- a) In the event of any monthly direct debit payments not being received, the Council will collect this during the following month. Should this payment not be received, members will be deemed to be in default of the agreement and the full outstanding balance of the membership for the current golfing season, or payment for two missed payments and one months notice, will become payable immediately.
- b) Any person in such default will not be permitted to play either of the courses during the year and may be barred from partaking in the golf membership all-inclusive ticket arrangements in future years.
- c) Any unpaid and outstanding balances shall attract interest at 5% above base rates during the period that such balances remain unpaid.
