PROJECT INFORMATION	Following internal and external Green Flag assessments, areas of improvement have been identified in conjunction with 'Friends' groups. The improvements shall continue to enhance our parks and green spaces to make them a safer and more attractive place to enjoy. Improvement works will be carried out in various parks which include: -	The local community have requested the removal of five internal Monoliths within the park in order to reduce the cost of maintenance and open up two of the entrances on Caldrum Street. One area surface to be replaced with grass and the other to be a hardstanding area due to health and safety requirements.
	Dawson Park: Improvements to fountain area to enhance features. Additional tree planting to connect existing panels and infilling of the path north of the bowling green.	
	Camperdown Park: Improve culverts at west side of park due to ongoing vandalism. Access and egress across the path will in future be safer for users.	
	Riverside Nature Park: Upgrading of sections of the path network. Also improvements to drainage and sightlines across the site including the removal of hedging.	
	Caird Park – Sight line and path improvements at Den O Mains to enhance and improve the safety for users. Also, replacement of fence at yard to improve safety and aesthetically enhance the area.	
	Templeton – Improve sections of path network due to ongoing flooding issues.	
	Trottick Ponds – Improvements to sections of path due to flooding and general wear and tear. Replacement of safety wooden fencing with metal fence. Works to control pond weed/ plants to improve safety and promote biodiversity.

PROJECT	Open Space Enhancements - Phase 3	Playground Improvements
PROJECT INFORMATION	It is proposed to implement a series of individual projects throughout the city improving and enhancing open spaces in all ward areas. Improvements shall incorporate re-contouring, new planting and upgrading of shrub areas and tree plantations. This shall also include infrastructure improvements such as signage, litter bins and benches and new planting of suitable tree specimens. Upon completion of works, the following areas will be visually and environmentally enhanced: Craigie St car park, Malcolm St, Peebles Dr ,St Matthews Lane, Taybank, Sandeman St, Seabraes embankment, Harefield Rd, Riverside Dr, Inchkeith Pl, Kirk St, Buttars Pl, Moncur Cresc, Dalclaverhouse, Summerfield Gdns, Dochart Tce, Marybank Lane, Dryburgh Sheltered Housing, Fithie/ Dighty Burn and various shrub beds citywide. Examples of proposed works are outlined below: St Matthews Lane – Removal of old play area and make area safe by creating a hardstanding area that can be used in the future. A later project phase will propose new play equipment to enhance play in the surrounding area. Malcolm Street – Renewal of benches and bins, upgrade soft landscaping with additional planting and improve sight lines. Taybank – Improvements include the removal of a substantial area of mature hedging which shall be replaced with a redesigned shrub bed area following further consultation with residents. Fithie/ Dighty Burn - Sight line improvements to make this well used area safer and more accessible for users by remediating soft landscaped areas and undertaking works which help reduce the potential of flooding risk. City wide shrub planting- Improve existing shrub bed areas across the city with additional planting to enhance sites. It is also proposed to carry out a mulching programme to reduce future weed growth and visually improve our parks and open spaces.	Carry out playground improvements to several play areas throughout the city. Works mainly to include new surfacing along with equipment enhancement. These works will address ongoing health and safety issues and will aesthetically improve the sites. Sites include Keswick Terrace, Kirkton Hillocks, Foggyley, Spey Drive, Beechwood, Cobden Street, Fintry Drive, Mill O Mains, Ballindean Road, Claypotts, and Marlee Road.
