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1. Recommendation

- 2.2 The Police and Fire Reform Act (Scotland) 2012 requires this plan to exist and for it to be developed in consultation with the Local Authority. The Plan must reflect local priorities and objectives that contribute to the delivery of successful outcomes, which have been identified through local community planning.

3. Development and Consultation

- 3.1 Consultation for the 2014 to 2017 Dundee Local Policing Plan is underway and priorities and objectives for this plan will be identified via this consultation. There is ongoing engagement with:
 - Elected Members, local community planning partnerships and community planning partners.
 - Local community groups.
 - Business Community.

 - Police Officers, staff and staff associations
- 3.2 Following consultation and the outcome of the interim strategic assessment Police Scotland will provide members with an opportunity to receive a presentation of the draft priorities and to highlight their own concerns and to assist with this a copy of the current interim Dundee Local Policing Plan for 2013 to 2014 is attached.
- 3.3 When the consultation phase is complete the draft Local Policing Plan will be circulated for comment and a copy of this draft plan will be presented to the Committee on 17 March 2014.
