### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To obtain approval for extending the existing contract.

#### 2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 That approval be given for extending the existing contract and incurring estimated additional expenditure of approximately £37,500.

# 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The Head of Finance has stated that the additional expenditure can be funded from the overall allowances within the Education Department's Capital Plan 2009/2010.

#### 4.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 The report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management.
- 4.2 There are no major issues.

## 5.0 **ESTIMATED ADDITIONAL EXPENDITURE**

- Reference is made to the meeting of the Education Committee held on 11 May 2009 when report No 278-2009 was approved. The report authorised entering into a negotiated contract with Dundee Contract Services in the amount of £138,490.12. Allowances for CDM coordinator services and professional fees were also approved giving total expenditure of £152,729.12
- 5.2 On commencing the roofing works the adjacent fascia was found to have deteriorated to a dangerous condition and emergency measures are necessary to stabilise and renew the fascia supports and cladding.
- 5.3 The additional cost to complete these works is estimated to be around £37,500 including allowances as before.

## 6.0 **CONSULTATIONS**

6.1 The Chief Executive, Head of Finance, Depute Chief Executives (Finance and Support Services) and the Director of Education have been consulted in the preparation of this report.
