## Areas for Improvement:

- The service should continue the excellent practice in the area of service users and carers participating in assessing and improving the quality of care and support; should continue the very good practice in responding to service users' care and support needs using person-centred values; and should continue to maintain excellent outcomes for residents in terms of service users and carers participating in assessing and improving the quality of the environment.
- The service wrote detailed risk assessments and kept them up to date, for example, for the prevention of falls. However, the safety measure in one risk assessment to keep a walking frame by the service user was not used. Also, the service user walked unaided with no obvious risk or need for intervention by staff.

# **Requirements and Recommendations:**

The Care Commission specified the requirement that:

 the provider must ensure that risk assessments proportionately state risks for service users and that those measures required to reduce risk are used in practice. This is in order to comply with The Regulation of Care (Requirements as to Care Services) (Scotland) (SSI 2002/114) (a) - a requirement for providers to make proper provision for the health and welfare of service users. Timescale for implementation: within four weeks of receiving this report.

#### Areas for Improvement:

- The majority of parents who returned satisfaction questionnaires to the Care Commission expressed a good level of satisfaction with most aspects of the nursery. However, the nursery should review and address, as appropriate, some matters of uncertainty or concern expressed by around 4% of parents relating to:
  - the reduction of outings and trips to local venues
  - the availability of space and staffing levels
  - o consultation procedures and information sharing involving parents and children
  - o a consistently welcoming ethos
  - o the continued management of safe parking near the nursery
- The inspector also made some comments regarding the size of furniture in the dining room, and the glare and heat from sunlight in one of the classrooms
- The inspector noted some issues about recruitment of staff and the recording of staff skills

#### **Requirements and Recommendations:**

No requirements were made by the Care Commission at this inspection. Their recommendations were as follows:

- The service should consider and address the issues on which parents expressed less satisfaction through the Care Commission questionnaires.
- The service should ensure that staff routinely communicate with parents and fully utilise all parental contacts to promote partnership working and ensure best outcomes for all children.

- The service should review its risk assessment procedures to ensure, that whilst maintaining safety, children's opportunities are not restricted.
- The nursery should fit window blinds, where required, to ensure greater comfort for the children attending.
- It is recommended that the provider ensure that a formal application process is followed for each period of employment.
- It is recommended that the provider audits the procedures for the recording of staff skills and qualification records.
