**Greener Streets: Better Lives** is a new Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) campaign to tackle the growing number of grey spaces spreading across the country and transform them into beautiful green places.

We're losing green in the competition for space: gardens are being paved over to make room for an increasing number of cars; high-density housing is replacing lower-density housing in many areas, and parks face a funding crisis and are at risk of deterioration and future loss.

**Greener Streets: Better Lives** sets out to challenge this. We want to work together with Bloomers, community groups, schools, councils and home owners to see thousands of grey spaces transformed into great green places for people and wildlife.

# Who can get involved?

Everyone! Whether you have a tiny windowsill to transform with a pot or you're working on a bigger project in the community – anyone can make a transformation, no matter what size.

## About RHS Britain in Bloom

Organised by the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS), Britain in Bloom is one of Europe's largest horticultural campaigns, involving over a thousand communities each year and creating lasting improvements to local environments for the benefit of residents, workers and visitors.

The RHS became the organising body for Britain in Bloom in 2001. The charity, along with the 16 "in Bloom" Regions and Nations, has introduced a number of developments. Judging of Britain in Bloom will take place in the first two weeks of August, with the winners being announced at an award ceremony taking place in Sunderland in October.

#### Why Dundee?

Following on its success at the 2014 Beautiful Scotland Awards, Dundee has been invited to take part in the Britain in Bloom 2015 Finals City Category. The Bonnie Dundee Group will be working in close partnership with Dundee City Council and other groups to take forward this entry. (continued on next page) •







# About RHS Britain in Bloom (continued)

### **Judging Criteria**

The Judging Criteria for Britain in Bloom is the same as Beautiful Scotland and covers three pillars:

Horticultural Achievement - including impact, good horticultural practise, in residential and community gardens, business areas, premises and green spaces. This section accounts for 50% of the maximum points.

**Environmental Responsibility** - including conservation and biodiversity, resource management, local heritage, local environmental quality and pride of place. This section accounts for 25% of the maximum points.

#### **Community Participation**

- development, continuity, communication and education, year round involvement, funding and support. This section accounts for 25% of the maximum points.
