- James Symsone gives his report (15 July 1646)
- The Clerk to attend the next meeting on 22 July (15 July 1646)
- The Clerk reports that the convention was pleased with his report and it was not necessary for him to continue to Newcastle and meet with the King (28 August 1646)

Defence, Posture of

- The town to be put in a posture of defence, the population to be deployed in Companies according to area and that Captains to be chosen the next day (16 March 1646)

- The ditch at the East end of town to be extended, all inhabitants to participate or be fined six shillings (28 April 1646)

- William Duncan elected hospitalmaster as Patrick Guthrie died (16 March 1646)
- The hospitalmaster to pay the poor their 20 shillings allowance for the past four weeks (18 March 1646)

 Late of Edinburgh, leaves a legacy of 3000 merks for the use of the hospital (2 June 1646) [later known as Johnston's Mortification]

- William Wright (Merchant) to be Kirk Treasurer for a year (18 May 1646)

Longforgan

- The death of David Browne the Minister creates a vacancy of Longforgan Parish Church (16 March 1646)
- Mr Alexander Mylne, expectant in divinity, to be approached (16 March 1646)
- the Kirk presented to Alexander Mylne (5 May 1646)

Mills see Mylnes

Milne, Colonel

- Colonel Milne regiment to be stationed in Dundee (4 November 1645)

Mylnes

- The tack of the Mylnes set for three years at 7000 merks yearly (24 March 1646)
- James Browne and William Watson to visit the Mylne (28 April 1646)

Packhouse

- The packhouse to be redeemed from James Symsone (28 April 1646)

Parliament

- Alexander Wedderburne to be Commissioner to Parliament at St Andrews, George Halyburton to be his assessor and deputy (4 November 1645)
- Alexander Wedderburne reports and produces an Act of parliament covering the losses incurred during the rebel assault (16 February 1646)

Perth

- A letter written to the Council of Perth to prevent any future misunderstandings (16 June 1646)

Piermaster

- Robert Stirling appointed (30 September 1645)

Plague

- Measures to prevent the spread of the plague from Fife (30 September 1645)
- All boats on both sides of the Tay to hand over their sails and anchors (7 October 1645)
- Another act against the spread of the plague (4 November 1645)

Provost (James Piersone)

- takes oath (4 November 1645)

Ramsay, John

- Found guilty of insulting two baillies and to be kept in custody (2 June 1646)

Symsone, James

- elected Commissioner to attend the next burgh's meeting where the stentroll will be changed (16 March 1646)

Tenements

- The council mediates between Thomas Wichtone and William Guthrie, tenement owners as to who owns the land between (20 March 1646)

Town's Watch

- Town Watch made up of inhabitants to be set (28 October 1645)
- The following appointed captains for the gates

Nethergate - Andrew Abercromby Overgate - Alexander Wederand Murrygate - Walter Rankine Seagate - Andrew Kynneireis (18 May 1646)

- Town watch to be set nightly (18 May 1646)

Wall Deacon

- Patrick Rodger appointed to be wall deacon (28 October 1645)

Warrant

- A warrant given to William Kynnereis to have as much ale as his ship requires on its voyage (24 March 1646)

Watch see Town

Watson, Thomas (Merchant)

- Found guilty of supplying powder to the enemy and fined 200 merks scots (8 April 1646)

West Kirk

- James Fithie to take up the psalm in the West Kirk when there is preaching and to be paid 50 merks annually for this (24 February 1646)

Whyt, Robert

- Council borrows 600 merks to pay to Robert Whyt in part payment for his powder (3 February 1646)

Works

- Work to be begun at the west graff, notice to be given by drum (28 October 1645)
