### 1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report considers the necessity to stop-up and remove from the List of Public Roads a length of carriageway and associated parking areas in the Dunsinane Avenue area utilising the powers of Town and Country Planning (Scotland) Act 1997.

### 2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve the preparation of a Stopping-up Order to stop-up and remove from the List of Public Roads a section of carriageway and associated parking areas in the Dunsinane Avenue area, Dundee.

### 3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The costs of preparing the Order will be met by the developer.

## 4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Following planning consent at Block 12, Dunsinane Avenue, it is necessary to remove a length of carriageway and associated parking areas in order for the development to proceed.
