1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To submit to the Committee a request for renewal of revenue funding to Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House, 2005-2006.

2.0 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Committee approves the level of grant funding amounting to £335,000 as set out in the Report.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The funding recommended is £335,000, which sum is provided for in the Leisure and Arts Department's Revenue Budget for 2005-2006, and included in the Budget at Appendix 1.
- The terms and conditions of grant will be contained within a Funding Agreement 2005-2006, between Dundee City Council and Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The renewal of revenue funding to Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House will ensure the continued provision of a popular cultural service, that local needs are met locally, and that opportunities for culture, leisure and recreation are readily available to all

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The mission statement of Dundee Repertory Theatre is to provide the highest possible arts service to Dundee and to be central to the cultural life of Dundee by investing in opportunities for those communities who may not normally benefit from mainstream arts provision. The building provides full disabled access to all public areas. Access is further facilitated by the operation of a range of discount and concessionary ticket offers.
- The Funding Agreement 2005-2006 will contain requirements that Dundee Repertory Theatre Main House practises equal opportunities policies in respect of its dealings with its public and staff.

6.0 MAIN TEXT

- In 2004-2005 Dundee Rep achieved national critical recognition for the quality of the work it provides for the city and surrounding area. The theatre was nominated for 10 awards in the National Critics Awards for Scotland and won 5 out of 10 of these nominations. These awards included best production, best actor performance, best director, best music and best design.
- 6.2 Highlights of the year included "Scenes from an Execution" by Howard Barker, an outstandingly successful production of "Macbeth" by William Shakespeare which

played to 98% capacity and which was attended by all Dundee's secondary schools, and a national tour of "Flora the Red Menace" by Kander and Ebb.

The company also began to develop its education work, carrying out workshops for local schools based on "Macbeth" and providing education resources to accompany the production.

Also for the first time a strand of visiting company work was programmed for children and young people.

The company continued to provide Dundee audiences with a varied programme of late night jazz, comedy, contemporary dance, community drama and theatre from some of the country's leading theatre companies.

6.3 Plans for 2005-2006 include:

- A stage version of the award winning film "The Graduate" adapted by Terry Johnston
- A co-production with leading touring company Paines Plough on a new play by Douglas Maxwell to play in Dundee and London
- The professional premiere of "Ubu the King" by Jarre adapted by leading Scottish writer David Greig, to be presented in Dundee, Glasgow and at The Barbican, London as part of a season of work entitled Young Genius
- A revival of the award winning "Scenes from an Execution" by Howard Barker, in association with the National Theatre of Scotland, which will tour to Glasgow, Edinburgh and be performed for another week in Dundee
- Continuing development of work aimed at children, young people and their families
- Programming of a year round season of dance, including visits from companies new to Dundee including Iceland Dance
- Continuing development of work of the Ensemble, seeking to recruit new members and continuing the graduate apprenticeships
- Continuing to develop the role of education within the theatre, working closely with Dundee City Council Education Department to provide a valuable resource for the city's schools
- Attendances at performances and events in 2004-2005 were 74,757. The theatre continues to be a substantial factor in the local economy and sustains 70 full-time equivalent jobs.

7.0 CONSULTATION

7.1 The Chief Executive, Depute Chief Executive (Finance), Depute Chief Executive (Support Services) and Assistant Chief Executive (Community Planning) have been consulted on this Report and are in agreement with its contents.
