6 BACKGROUND

6.1 **Dangerous Building Notices**

The City Engineer investigated 18 incidents relating to public safety of dangerous buildings during the month of October 2003. No formal Notices and Orders were issued under Section 13(1c) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

6.2 <u>Direct Action Taken</u>

Direct action has been taken in two instances to ensure public safety is maintained under Section 13(1b) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

6.2.1 4 Duncan Street

Keith Richard Smith, 70 Camphill Road Broughty Ferry

Unsecured building – Dundee Contract
 Services secured the front entrance.

6.2.2 West Marketgait No1-21

Unite, 21 Brown Street, Dundee

Falling delaminating masonry. Footway barricaded until owner carried out remedial inspection/repair.

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6.3 Advisory Letters Issued

Letters were issued to three owners advising them to have their properties inspected and to undertake the necessary repairs to the following properties.

- 6.3.1 <u>15 Gellatly Street</u> Loose masonry, vegetation on building cracked/missing brickwork.
- 6.3.2 <u>23, 25A, 25B Baluniefield Road</u> Partially collapsed boundary wall, upgraded stairway, debris/waste layers on the ground at
 - the rear of the property.
- 6.3.3 <u>63-75 Seagate</u> Defective chimney, delaminating masonry missing pointing.
