1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report details the tender received in relation to the Camperdown Growing Hub and requests a decision on acceptance thereof.

- 4.3 The revenue funding for operation of the property is projected to be in the region of £25,000-£30,000 and will be contained from within Neighbourhood Services, Environmental Management revenue budget allowance.
