1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To submit to the Committee a request for renewal of Revenue Grant Funding to Dundee Ice Arena for the year 2008-2009.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 That the Committee approves the level of Revenue Grant funding amounting to £100,000 as set out in the report.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The funding recommended is £100,000 which sum is provided for in the Leisure and Communities Department's Revenue Budget 2008-2009, as shown in the budget at Appendix 1.
- 3.2 The terms and conditions of these payments will be contained within a Management Agreement 2008-2009 between Dundee City Council and Dundee Ice Arena.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

4.1 Dundee Ice Arena provides ice time for all major ice sports including ice hockey, figure skating, speed skating and curling. It also provides regular facilities for public skating.

4.2 Review of 2007-2008

During 2007/2008 the Ice Arena continued to host Scottish Premier and National League ice hockey and a full range of curling competitions. Extensive junior development programmes were delivered for hockey, curling, figure skating and speed skating. An adult "Learn to Skate" programme has been introduced during the Winter and will continue over the Summer period. The facility's versatility, convenient location and unrestricted parking is demonstrated by the increasing business for its function suites and conference rooms.

They also successfully hosted the British Short Track Speed Skating Championships which was the first time this event had been held in Scotland.

4.3 **Major Plans for 2008-2009**

In 2008/2009 the Arena will be hosting several major events including the Scottish Recreational Ice Hockey Championships, Royal Air Force championships, Northern League Finals, Scottish Cup Finals In addition the Arena will be the venue for the Dundee Spring Garden Show.

A programme of figure skating and ice hockey schools will once again be held during the school holidays which will involve international coaches from Canada, USA and Russia. There are now several junior competitors who have come through the development ranks in their respective sports since the arena opened, attaining national and international recognition.

Once again one of their resident coaches will be acting as a technical adviser for the World Figure Skating Championships.

4.4 Dundee Ice Arena sustained 17 full time equivalent jobs in Dundee during 2007-2008 and they are projected to achieve 88% of their income from non public services in 2008-2009.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management.
