1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise the Committee of progress with implementation of the Leisure and Communities Department Service Plan, which was approved by Committee in January 2008.

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approves the revised table of Service Plan projects attached to this report.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 Projects and actions proposed in the plan are provided for in the Department's Revenue Budget and Capital Plan. Where projects are contingent on the achievement of additional funding from external sources, or the continuation of existing funding, these are identified in the plan and may be the subject of additional reports to committee.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

4.1 This report updates the Department's service plan 2007-2011, as approved by the committee on 28 January 2008. The aim is to update the projects under the relevant Department objectives. The opportunity has also been taken to check that the department's objectives are aligned to the Dundee Single Outcome Agreement. The Department's performance indicators are regularly scrutinised by the Best Value and Improvement Sub-Committee, and in the Council's annual performance report, as well as by the Department's management team. The positive contribution of the department's Community Learning and Development work to Dundee City Council's Educational functions, highlighting specific examples of good practice, was confirmed by HMIe, in their INEA follow-up inspection in 2008.

4.2 Links to the Single Outcome Agreement

These will be announced in April 2009. The overall process should take approximately ten months to complete.
Develop and implement the Anti-Poverty Action Plan	A revised plan, and reporting structure, overseen by the Building Stronger Communities Theme Group, and reflecting the Scottish Government Framework to Tackle Poverty and Inequality, will be finalised, along with the Single Outcome Agreement, by late summer 2009.

4.7 Performance Management

Each Service Area in the department is also subject to a range of self-evaluation and/or external scrutiny frameworks. All the projects and performance measures are scrutinised in a corporate system and reported to the Improvement & Efficiency Board, and exception reports are produced on performance falling behind targets or project milestones. The projects included in the attached appendix are all contained in the council's online planning and monitoring database, for ongoing updating on progress. The Service Plan update will be added to the plans and performance page of the Council's website.
