1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To advise committee of the forthcoming exhibition 'The Scottish Photographic Federation: The First Hundred Years' and its supporting programme.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 Costs associated with the exhibition of £5,000 will be shared by the Scottish Photographic Federation (SPF) and the Leisure and Arts Department.
- 3.2 The main costs of the exhibition are associated with installation, marketing and administration, and with the supporting public events programme for adults and children.
- 3.3 The Leisure and Arts department's contribution will be £2,500 which will be met from the department's Revenue Budgets 2002/2003 and 2003/2004.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The project supports the principles "opportunities for culture, leisure and recreation are available to all" and "access to the skills, knowledge and information needed to enable everyone to play a full part in society".

- 6.1 The Scottish Photographic Federation is a non-profit making organisation represented by amateur clubs in Scotland, and has held an annual exhibition since 1903.
- This, the centenary exhibition, will be a celebration of the best of the past century's creative output of Scottish and Scottish-based amateur photographers. It will show how the subject has evolved as a leisure pursuit over this period, and through its supporting public events programme. It will look forward to how photography might continue to develop as a popular leisure pursuit in the future. It will run for 5 weeks from Sunday 30 March 2003 Sunday 4

May 2003.

- 6.3 The McManus Galleries has enjoyed a close association with SPF since its inception, several founder clubs coming from this area, and the first SPF meeting being held in the Dundee area.
- 6.4 The McManus Galleries is privileged to have been chosen as the venue for the SPF Centenary year lead event, following the success of many annual SPF `salons` over the years. Following the official opening of the exhibition on Saturday 29 March 2003, the salon will be judged and the winners announced.
- 6.5 A full supporting programme of public events and activities will include free guided tours, slide and print shows, and workshops for adults organised by the SPF, and workshops for children co-ordinated by the Leisure and Arts Department. (see attached appendix: public events)
