### 1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report considers the requirement to keep Elected Members informed of the changes to the provision of Disabled Persons' Parking Places within Dundee.

#### 2 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee note the information contained within this report as it will be sent to Transport Scotland for data analysis and processing. This is a legal requirement and will be reported annually both to Transport Scotland and Elected Members.

#### 3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 There are no direct financial implications as a result of this report. All costs relating to Disabled Persons' Parking Places will be outlined within separate reports which will be requesting permission to vary the existing on and off-street Traffic Regulation Orders for Dundee.

#### 4 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The information contained within this report is for the reporting period covering the last financial year (April 2012 to March 2013).
- 4.2 Further to the collection of data from our Social Work Department to the City Development Department, it has still been an on-going and continued exercise to manage an accurate database in order to maintain an accurate provision of parking on our road network.
- 4.3 In the last year, Dundee City Council removed 386 disabled on-street parking bays as they were no longer required and added 57 new disabled on-street parking bays.
- The Car Parking Team are currently reviewing the provision of disabled parking bays in all offstreet car parks to bring the provision into line with our agreed policies. This will provide a minimum of 3 disabled parking bays in smaller car parks and 6% of total car park capacity in our larger car parks. Transport Scotland has confirmed that the standard of road markings in off-street bays can deviate away from on-street standards which has prevented the necessity to alter disabled bay designs in Council operated car parks. Dundee City Council will look to use the bay design as set out in the Department for Transport Inclusive Mobility Document where possible.
- 4.5 Dundee City Council is required to offer enforcement of disabled parking to all off-street car park operators every 2 years. This invitation was sent out to over 800 private car park operators in February 2013.
- 4.6 Further to the consultation exercise of private car park operators throughout the city, there was only one request received to enforce the disabled parking regulations on private land. Lining within this private car park is to an enforceable standard and minimal signing will be provided by the operator.
- 4.7 Many of the Council's on-street bays still do not meet the current standards. Records are kept relating to the location of these bays and the work required to rectify them. An action plan is now in place to repaint these bays over the next 2 financial years. Further to the

completion of this work, an annual maintenance programme will be in place to maintain the required standard.

- 4.8 Transport Scotland granted special authorisation which allows the Council to enforce all of our existing non-prescribed disabled bay road markings until they have been brought up to the current standard. These bays have variations in size and colour which deviate from the standards set out in Traffic Signs and General Directions 2002.
- 4.9 The Schedule for 2012-2013 which is detailed in Appendix 1 provides the detailed information specified in the Disabled Persons Parking Places Order. Sections 1-9 in the Schedule for 2012-2013 can be referred to at the following weblink:
