1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for a grant award to Dundee Voluntary Action as part of a three year Service Level Agreement.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

2.1 It is recommended that the Committee approve payment of £41,450 to Dundee Voluntary Action following the satisfactory assessment of the Service Specification contained in Schedule 1 of the Agreement during 2009-10.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 The cost will be met from the Leisure and Communities Department's 2010/11 Revenue Budget.
- 3.2 The way in which Dundee City Council's financial support contributes to Dundee Voluntary Action's running costs is detailed in Appendix 2.

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Following a review of departmental roles and responsibilities, it was agreed in August 2007 that Lead Department responsibility for the Council's liaison with DVA should transfer from the Social Work Department to the Leisure and Communities Department (Committee Report No 350-2007).
- 4.2 This decision was made to take account of the changing role of DVA, which began life in 1953 as Dundee Council of Social Service and has since evolved into current membership. The organisation's primary aim is to promote the interests and serve the needs of the voluntary sector in Dundee
- 4.3 The new Service Level Agreement, adopted in August 2007, fully reflects the role of DVA as a Community Planning Partner. The Agreement sets out how DVA will undertake to provide facilitation, communication, and representation and development services to enable local voluntary sector organisations to engage effectively with Dundee City Council and the Dundee Partnership.

5.0 KEY PERFORMANCE RESULTS

- 5.1 Appendix 1 shows the full service specification and progress report. Key Performance results for this year include:
 - Representation of the voluntary sector on strategic planning and partnership bodies (service specification 1). This year has seen DVA continue to maintain representation

at top levels of the Dundee Partnership in service specification 5. The mapping exercise of the voluntary sector in Dundee is now underway. Agreement has now been reached at Dundee Partnership level on development of a "One Stop Shop" as the best means to fulfil Scottish Government requirements to create local Third Sector Interfaces. This approach will bring together all of the resources and services currently provided by DVA and Volunteer Centre Dundee in a single point of access. The new structure will be managed by a joint group, with representation from DVA, VCD and the Social Economy Partnership. It is expected that these plans will be endorsed by the Scottish Government by the autumn of 2010.

- Development and implementation of the Dundee Compact (service specification 2). The Compact is now being reviewed in light of the above developments. An updated Compact and action plan, including specific reference to links with the Interface, will be the subject of a consultation/conference in October 2010.
- Development and support of voluntary sector Forums (service specification 3). DVA continues to support a wide range of forums which relate directly to strategic themes of the Community Plan. The past year has seen improved voluntary sector input to the CHP and a re-structuring of forums and involvement mechanisms for work with Children and Young People.
- Leading and supporting the development of the Social Economy Partnership and Forum (service specification 4). The Social Economy Network has now been formally linked to the Voluntary Gateway Management Group as part of the development of the Third Sector Interface.
- Participation in the development of local community learning and development initiatives and representation on the Community Learning and Development Partnership (service specification 5). DVA has recently appointed an Information and Training Co-ordinator with responsibility for maintaining and improving training programmes and publicity.
- 5.2 Regular assessment meetings between Dundee City Council and DVA have taken place and these have ensured effective delivery of the service specification during 2009-2010.
- 5.3 Continued funding for DVA through a Service Level Agreement is an effective way to ensure that the voluntary sector can participate and contribute fully as Partners in delivering the outcomes of Dundee's Single Outcome Agreement. It also contributes to the sustainability of the organisation and its support to voluntary organisations in the city.

6.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

6.1 Sustainability

The SLA specifies actions which will improve the Council's ability to engage effectively with the voluntary sector and to involve these organisations in working together to achieve the Community Plan's underpinning principles of sustainability, social inclusion and active citizenship.

6.2 Anti-Poverty

The SLA's service specification facilitates action which contributes to the following key policy objectives for tackling poverty and social exclusion:

- delivering services which meet the needs of groups or people who are likely to be poor or excluded
- developing participation in society
- Empowerment through participation in decision-making and collective action.

6.3 Equal Opportunities Implications

The SLA sets out, in paragraphs 11 and 21, specific requirements that DVA shall provide the services specified in a manner which complies with statutory requirements on Equality and Human Rights, promotes equality and monitors provision of its services to socially excluded groups.

7.0 CONSULTATION

7.1 The Chief Executive, Depute Chief Executive (Support Services), Assistant Chief Executive and Director of Finance have been consulted on the content of the report. The Chief Executive, DVA, has been involved in the development of the SLA.
