1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 At the Policy and Resources Committee on 28 June 2002 (Report No 71-2002) authority was given to the Dundee Community Safety Partnership to make small grant awards up to the value of £500 to voluntary/community organisations. The specific grant awards made for the financial year 2002-2003 are detailed in Appendix 1.
- 6.2 The strategic priorities for the Partnership are as follows:
 - Building and sustaining community reassurance and participation.
 - Tacking Substance Misuse.
 - Improving Road Safety.
 - Reducing Crime and the Fear of Crime

7.1 Consultation has taken place with the Chief Executive and the Directors of Finance, Support Services and Neighbourhood Resources and Development. The grants have all been subject to approval by the Community Safety Partnership.
