1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval to accept the lowest offers to carry out the necessary works to improve pedestrian and traffic movement segregation at Menzieshill High School.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 Approval is recommended to the acceptance of the lowest offers submitted by the undernoted contractors:
 - (i) Renovo Contracts Ltd for the formation of footpath and provision of road markings in the amount of £9182.00; and
 - (ii) Grant Wilson Fabrications Ltd for the formation of new pedestrian gate in the amount of £695.00.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The Depute Chief Executive (Finance) has stated that:

- 3.1 This expenditure can be met from the Education Capital Budget 2009/10, and
- 3.2 The revenue implications arising from this expenditure in respect of financing costs is £759 per annum.

5.1 The Councils Health and Safety Section carried out a Workplace Transport Audit at Menzieshill High School, which highlighted the lack of separation of pedestrians and vehicles accessing the school site. The proposed works are in compliance with the recommendations contained therein.
