PROJECT INFORMATION	<p>The works comprise the construction of a new underground surface water conveyance system in Lochee High Street, and a new raingarden in vacant land located between Aimer Square and Bank Street. The raingarden site was allocated for housing in the 2019 Local development Plan, however, existing drainage infrastructure running through the site makes the construction of housing on the site unviable.</p> <p>The new surface water drainage infrastructure will provide a connection point:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>for surface water generated by any development of the current vacant land located between St Ann Lane and Lochee High Street (site of Weavers Village).</li> <li>for surface water generated by the development of the St Lukes Church building and surrounding site.</li> <li>for future disconnection of surface water from the public combined sewer in the area.</li> </ul> <p>The works will contribute towards increasing flood resilience in the Lochee and downstream areas and, when not functioning as surface water storage, the raingarden will also provide a place for the community to come together, increase biodiversity, and aligns with the wider Water Resilient Dundee drainage strategy being developed for the Lochee area.</p>

PROJECT INFORMATION	<p>This project will deliver new transformative street infrastructure for Union Street, Dundee. The street will be fully pedestrianised, improving connections between the city centre and the Waterfront. It will also provide improved crossings over the Nethergate to the north and Yeaman Shore to the south to provide a fully cohesive connection. What was once a road will be transformed to high-quality, accessible, level public space with seating, shelters, a public events space, planting, cycle parking, space for outdoor eating and drinking and new and improved lighting. Vehicular access for deliveries (between 11pm and 11am) and for cycles will be maintained via a central "strip" which will have priority pedestrian crossings. This project has been co-designed with members of the public and local business since 2021 and is now ready to proceed to the construction phase of the project.</p>
