1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval for the payment of administrative grants for the financial year April 2002 to March 2003 to Community Councils in existence or established during the year and to confirm the formulae for payment.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

It is recommended that:

- 2.1 administrative grants be awarded to all Community Councils currently in existence or established during 2002/2003 in accordance with Dundee City Council Scheme For The Operation Of Community Councils (Report 332/1997).
- grants are awarded according to the following formulae: a lump sum of £330 per Community Council plus 1.2 p per resident in each Council's area, (See Appendices 1 and 2).
- 2.3 an administration grant of £440 is awarded to the Association of Dundee Community Councils.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The sum of £4,859 can be contained within the Department's Revenue Budget for 2002/2003.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 Theme: All sections of the community are empowered to participate in decision-making.

Support to Community Councils is an integral part of the Council's Decentralisation policy.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 This report details payments in the form of Administrative Grants made to Community Councils during the financial year 1 April 2001 to 31 March 2002. (Appendix 3)
- 6.2 The report sets out in detail proposals for the payment of Administrative Grants to Community Councils as outlined in the Dundee City Council Scheme For The Operation Of Community Councils.
- 6.3 The proposals include a formula that ensures all Community Councils are awarded a basic lump sum of £330 plus an additional 1.2 p per resident. To be eligible for a grant a Community Council must make formal application and include audited annual accounts for the financial year 2001/2002 where appropriate. The Community Council should have less than twice the amount of their recommended grant in their administrative account at 31 March 2002.
- The present Dundee City Council Scheme For The Operation Of Community Councils has provision for 17 Community Councils in Dundee. Currently there are four Community Councils; Broughty Ferry, Fintry, Hilltown and West End.

The term of existing Community Councils will end in November 2002. It is planned that new Community Councils will be established in November 2002.

- In addition, the Association of Dundee Community Councils was formed to enable Councils to share information, develop training programmes and promote new Community Councils.
- 6.6 It is proposed that the City Council continues to work in partnership with the Association of Dundee Community Councils to promote new Community Councils in areas where none exist.
- 6.7 Existing Community Councils would be awarded a grant according to the formula detailed in Appendix 1.
- 6.8 Community Councils established later than 31 October 2002 would be awarded a grant according to the formula detailed in Appendix 2.

7.0 CONSULTATION

7.1 The Chief Executive, Directors of Finance and Support Services have been consulted in the preparation of this Report.
