#### 1. **PURPOSE OF REPORT**

To report on progress to date with the objectives, projects and reviews contained in the Council Plan 2003-2007.

#### 2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

It is recommended that members:

- i) note the contents of this report, including the attached tables which detail the progress made on the Council Plan 2003-2007.
- ii) agree that, as part of the commitment to Public Performance Reporting, this information on progress be added to the copy of the Council Plan which appears on the Council website, and copies of this report be made available to partner organisations and local groups on request.

#### 3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no direct financial implications of the report. Any financial issues relating to objectives, projects or reviews contained in the Plan will be reported separately to Committee.

#### 4. LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

The Council's policies on sustainability are reflected throughout the Plan, and this also includes a specific theme of 'Caring for the Dundee Environment'. A number of objectives and projects within the Plan relate to anti-poverty work.

#### 5. EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

The Council's equal opportunities policies are reflected throughout the Plan, and this also includes a specific theme of 'Equality Action'.

### 6. BACKGROUND

- 6.1 At its meeting on 20 October 2003, Committee approved the Council Plan 2003-2007. The Plan includes a number of strategic objectives, projects and plans for best value reviews, and also includes a commitment to report progress on these.
- 6.2 Attached are tables which provide a concise summary of progress on each of the objectives, projects and reviews in the Plan. These tables have been produced using the Strategic Plan Monitoring Database, a system introduced in 2005 which keeps track of progress with all items in the Council Plan, departmental Service Plans and other key strategic documents. This shows that 89% of items in the plan are assessed as completed or on schedule to be achieved.

- 6.3 Notable achievements to date include:
  - learning and working schools PPP project on target; first phase of central waterfront complete; over 15,000 log-ins per month to IT facilities in libraries and learning centres; Cultural Enterprise Officer in post; airport passenger numbers growing significantly in past 6 months; new business plan for City Centre Action Group; launch of Dundee Retail Awards
  - health and care thriving programme continues at The Shore; good progress on healthy eating/cooking classes in local communities; evaluation of child protection undertaken; new Joint Health Improvement Plan agreed with NHS; supported toothbrushing and water cooling facilities in all primaries
  - community safety worked with 30 community groups over past year; support services available to victims of anti-social behaviour; 7 teams of community wardens operational; 59% of streetlighting in residential areas converted to white lighting; extension of DUNCAN initiative to housing estates
  - building stronger communities local community engagement strategies being further developed; major new housing developments approved; close cleaning company expanding
  - caring for the environment blue flag status achieved for Broughty Ferry beach; planning complete for Baxter Park following public consultation; recycling rate well above national target; working group tackling problems of derelict land; energy savings and reduction in CO<sup>2</sup> emissions on target
  - best value new guidance being prepared on service planning in response to best value audit; seven departments have completed EFQM assessments
  - customer focus new 'customer first' strategy agreed; three contact centres in operation; 44,000 multi-application smartcards in circulation; 43 online transactions available
  - renewing democracy review of neighbourhood partnership network underway; Dundee Civic Forum established
  - sound corporate management sustainable development policy approved; plans for Dundee House agreed; Council Tax collection rate now over 90%; equality partnership established; accessibility audits complete
- 6.4 A number of plans items in the attached tables are assessed as being 'behind schedule'. Significant issues along with the reasons for progress being behind schedule and the action being taken as a result, include:
  - major redevelopment of McManus Galleries will begin on site this month, following a slight delay in the tendering process
  - the target set for recycling in 2005/06 was 37%, and the actual rate achieved is likely to be just over 30%. A delay in funding meant that new recycling infrastructure could not be introduced, but performance is still good compared to other authorities and is expected to improve further as new services are introduced
  - efforts to reduce the level of building material waste are now being addressed corporately as part of the Sustainability Action Plan
  - development of sites for business use, new business floorspace and further incubator phases at Dundee Technopole require resources to be identified

- a number of best value reviews are behind schedule, and a separate report on these, and the proposed programme for 2006/07, will be submitted to the Best Value Sub-Committee
- 6.5 Significant items in the plan due to commence or be achieved in the 2006-2007 year include:
  - reviews to consider joining up services as part of a proposed one-stop-shop
  - rail tunnel strengthening as next phase of central waterfront
  - further 10,000 properties to be added to new kerbside collection service for glass, plastic and aluminium
  - discussion on creation of a 'green business park'
  - launch of an improved Convention Bureau service
- 6.6 As part of the commitment to Public Performance Reporting, the Council Plan is available on the Council's website. It is proposed to add the information on progress contained in this report. Copies of this report will also be made available to partner organisations and local groups on request.
