1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform the Committee of the exhibition 'Double Take' and its supporting programme.

2.0 RECOMMENDATION

2.1 That the Committee approves the contents of this report.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The estimated total cost of the exhibition and its supporting programme is £8,000 which can be met from the Arts and Heritage Department's 2001-2002 revenue budget.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 The project provides access to facilities, goods and services not achieved at expense of the environment and the project encourages the public to consider the provision and needs of a sustainable environment.
- 4.2 The project's events programme is designed to encourage the sustainable use of resources.

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 This project supports the principle of making Dundee a more family friendly and barrier-free city, in terms of the issues it addresses, and the community based events being held, which cater particularly for young people, the elderly and disadvantaged groups.
- 5.2 The project aims to foster the integrity of local urban communities: to encourage a sense of identity and pride of association through best urban design practice, and through this to attract newcomers to the city and encourage existing populations to stay.
- 5.3 The project aims to provide a forum for on-going dialogue about aspects of Dundee's local/social history, through informal reminiscence groups and as part of information gathering for future development needs.

6.0 MAIN TEXT

6.1 The exhibition will take place from 30 June - 2 September 2001, and feature as part of the 'Summer In The City'. It aims to serve the local population as well as to attract visitors to the city.

The exhibition will consist of architectural and townscape paintings by the Dundee born artist Andrew Neilson depicting Dundee during the 1950's and 1960's, alongside contemporary photographs of the sites. The areas of the town represented are the Overgate, the Wellgate, the Hilltown, the High Street, the Nethergate, the Harbour and Waterfront. Most of these have been significantly changed by redevelopment in the past half-century.

The exhibition will include archival material and historic and modern film footage, supplied by Neighbourhood Resources and Development, Planning and Transportation and Support Services (Archives). Dundee Contemporary Arts Ltd also collaborated in preparing the exhibition.

6.2 The project will inform people about the significance of historic buildings and of the townscape featured. It aims to raise awareness of the local heritage by encouraging visitors to visit the sites featured in the exhibition as they presently exist. It will play a part in stimulating enquiry and debate on the principles and practice of good town planning and architecture towards sustainable urban renewal.

The events programme will highlight the role of science and the arts, crafts and design in the process of preserving and developing coherent townscapes and integrated communities.

The programme includes holiday and weekend workshop activities for young people, guided tours for adults and reminiscence sessions on old Dundee for retirement groups.

- 6.3 The public events programme will be launched on Saturday 30 June 2001 at McManus Galleries with a slide-presentation on the City Centre regeneration scheme at 2.00 pm followed by the first reminiscence group on 'The Hilltown' at 3.00. Music will be provided by 'Elles Belles' following their performance at the Hilltown Fun Day. There will also be Young People's Events in McManus Galleries Activity Room.
- 6.4 Summer holiday midweek workshops for playscheme groups will be held during the weeks beginning 2 July, 9 July, 16 July and 6 August. They will follow the theme of 'Buildings About You', to include the following options:
 - mapping, with town plans, paint, collage and drawing
 - windows and glass, working with photographs, acetate and tissue
 - design and construction, using card, prints and projection

These sessions are designed for primary age children plus children with special needs, drawn from local community playschemes and similar projects. Groups attending will be accompanied by playscheme workers and volunteers.

Groups which have expressed an interest in taking part, as an integral part of their own summer activities, include 'Schools Out' After School Club, Broughty Ferry, Charleston, Menzieshill and Barnardos Playschemes; Mid-Lin Summer Project and Whitfield Activity Complex.

6.5 Saturday Workshops for Children begin on the 18 August with a Creative Workshop for 8 - 12 Years 1 - 3 pm. Looking at Line and Shade will examine the shapes of buildings in the exhibition creating models of high rise tower blocks in plastic and collage.

On 25 August there will be a Family Workshop for under 8 years olds (to be accompanied by an adult) from 1 - 3 pm.

Designing Towns - Old and New will interpret the exhibition and create models of buildings old and new.

On 1 September there will be workshops entitled **Take Yourself to Another City** which will look at some unusual buildings then design models, 12 - 1.00 pm 8 - 12 year old, 1.30 - 2.30 pm Under 8s (to be accompanied by an adult).

6.6 Adult Events include, Reminiscence Groups led by artsworker Ruth Donnolly, in a programme entitled **Down Memory Lane**

There will be guided tours of the exhibition with entertainment on Old Dundee. Designed for senior citizens, the event will start at 3pm. Charge £2.00 for refreshments.
