1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of the report is to seek approval to award the tender for the re-pointing of a section of the boundary wall at Camperdown Country Park.

2.0 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 Following evaluation of the tender it is recommended that the tender submission by RBS Muir, Strathmartine, Dundee at £22 per square metre be accepted.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The tender has been evaluated on the basis of the re-pointing of a square metre of wall and there is an allowance of £20,000 within the Leisure & Communities Capital Budget over 2008/09 and 2009/10.

4.0 MAIN TEXT

The tender was issued to ensure the continuity of a phased approach to the restoration of the boundary wall at Camperdown Country Park, to include the clean out and re-pointing of all joints with a specific lime water mix.

Tenders were submitted by Logie Building Services, Dundee, RBS Muir, Strathmartine by Dundee, T&N Gilmartin (Contractors) Ltd, Cupar and Vermicom Environment Services, Lochgelly

Following evaluation of the tenders it is recommended that the offer from RBS Muir, Strathmartine, Dundee at an equivalent £22 per square metre which includes the repointing of joints and also the repairs as required be accepted.

It should be noted that there is allowance of £10,000 in the Leisure & Communities Capital Budget for 2008/09 and £10,000 for 2009/10 making a total allowance of £20,000 for the works.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS
