1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform the Committee of the forthcoming Exhibition "FLAVOUR" Celebrating Young People in the Arts and its supporting programme.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The estimated cost of mounting this Exhibition is £5,000 which can be met from the Leisure & Arts Revenue Budget 2004/2005.

4.0 LOCAL AGENDA 21 IMPLICATIONS

4.1 The project supports the principles "opportunities for culture, leisure and recreation are available to all" and "access to the skills, knowledge and information needed to enable everyone to play a full part in society".

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES IMPLICATIONS

- 5.1 The project enhances the position of cultural and heritage resources for all age groups.
- 5.2 The project provides opportunities for people of all ages regardless of ability, social background, race, sex or disadvantage.

6.0 MAIN TEXT

6.1 The FLAVOUR Exhibition will take place in McManus Galleries from Saturday 12 February 2005 to Sunday 20 March 2005.

The Exhibition will celebrate the creative talents of young people within the City bringing together a range of projects and groups in order to investigate the diversity of interests, life-styles and aspirations.

The work shown will include past and present projects linked to The McManus Exhibition and Outreach Programme and will also offer an insight into current Arts Development Projects such as Urban Takeover and Portal, which underline the ongoing commitment to support young people's participation in the arts.

6.2 In addition to the exhibition, a programme of activities and events aimed at young people will be delivered. These will include art workshops, Soundbase sessions, performances and gallery events. With the support of youth work staff, teachers and artists, project participants will assist in the delivery of a number of activities including installation, documentation, invigilation and gallery

talks.

Projects and Groups involved:

- PORTAL at Hot Chocolate Ministries
- Urban Takeover
- The Helm Training Group Ergo & Encompass groups
- Xplore Alternative curriculum school groups

6.3 Urban Takeover

A four day urban arts event for young people was held in The Caird Hall in October 2004. The event was delivered in partnership with Communities Department, D.A.F.T, Hot Chocolate Ministries and Seagate Studios

Work created during this project will form a large part of the exhibition. This will include backdrops, sculptures, photography as well as film and sound. MC's will open the Exhibition the show with a live performance from street dancers.

6.4 **PORTAL**

PORTAL offers a regular programme of arts activities, supporting young people aged 16+ who may be interested in pursuing a career in the arts and creative industries. The Programme includes portfolio preparation, printmaking, drawing and painting, sculpture, craft projects, photography and film making projects, information on activities within the city and visits to exhibitions, galleries and artist studios/spaces.

Since November 2004, PORTAL have been working in partnership with Hot Chocolate Ministries and DAFT to deliver a series of outreach projects to young people at The Steeple.

A selection of the work will be shown in the Exhibition.

6.5 **The Helm Training Project** – Encompass and ERGO groups

The Helm work with young people who are outwith formal education or employment and whose lives may be affected by issues such as learning disability, behavioural problems, family or other social problems. Both groups are regular visitors to The McManus Galleries and have participated in several exhibition outreach projects, notably Plastic Beach's Boat Project. They have also held their own exhibition in the Activity Room at McManus Galleries (SHINE).

Young people will be taking part in a collaborative sculpture project between both groups at McManus Galleries as part of their regular programme of arts activities. The outcome of this will be shown at the exhibition.

6.6 XPLORE

Young people supported by Xplore have been regular visitors to the McManus Galleries and participants in Arts Development projects such as Young Horizons and Fusion Crew. Work for the exhibition will include metal sculptures (The Bug & Robo Man) and work from the Young Horizons project
