### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform the Committee of the Millennium exhibition Men at Work: Photographs by Joe McKenzie, being held at the McManus Galleries from 15 July - 3 September 2000.

#### 2.0 RECOMMENDATION

### 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The costs of the exhibition are £4,000. The costs of the outreach programme and associated marketing are being met with a grant of £2,500 from the Millennium Fund. The balance of £1,500 will be met from the Arts & Heritage Revenue budget.

# 6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 Men at Work: Photographs by Joe McKenzie is drawn from the City's permanent collection and features two sections, *Men and Locomotives* and *Death of a Station*, from the Dundee: City in Transition series. This is the first time that the two sections have been shown in their entirety since the series was first shown in 1966.
- 6.2 Joe McKenzie's photographs are always powerful, often full of humour and have a great respect for the dignity of working people. *Men and Locomotives* is a fascinating insight into the railway staff and locomotives that kept travellers on the move. *Death of a Station*, on the other hand, is a poignant record of the demolition of the magnificent Dundee West station.
- 6.3 The outreach programme will include Sunday Family activities and Wednesday activity sessions throughout the exhibition run. A series of photographic workshops for adults and children is planned. A variety of railway related children's activities will be available in the Gallery.
