1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To inform the Committee of the forthcoming exhibition **Reflection: New Works for the City's Collection**. The exhibition will be held at the McManus Galleries from Saturday 25 June to Sunday 28 August 2005.

 In addition, the exhibition will include loans of work by Gavin Turk and Claire Barclay from the collections of Aberdeen Art Gallery and Paisley Museum and Art Gallery.
- 6.3 The National Collecting Scheme for Scotland is operated by the Contemporary Art Society for the purchase of challenging visual and applied arts with funds from the National Lottery through the Scottish Arts Council. Additional grant-aid to support Dundee purchases has been secured from the National Fund for Acquisitions and

the National Art Collections Fund.

The McManus Galleries is one of 6 NCSS partners, the others being the City Art Centre, Edinburgh, Pier Art Centre, Orkney, Aberdeen Art Gallery, Hunterian Art Gallery, Paisley Museum and Art Gallery.
