1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report seeks approval for the payment of an Adult Education Support Fund grant for the financial year April 2007 to March 2008, to Broughty Ferry Educational and Recreation Association.

5.0 EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES

5.1 Adult Education Associations encourage Dundee citizens to participate in lifelong learning regardless of their race, colour, gender, sexuality, age, class, ethnic or religious beliefs, basic skills, disability, trade union activity or employment status.

6.0 MAIN TEXT

6.1 This is a locally run voluntary organisation providing low cost learning opportunities.

- 6.2 Support from the Adult Education Fund contributes to the costs the association incurs for lets, administration, marketing and offering concessions.
- 6.3 The organisation provides 59 classes per academic year, offering 1,073 learning places.
- In order to ensure the organisation promotes equal opportunities as a condition of grant for 2007-2008, it is being required to collect more relevant learner information. This requires the setting up of an IT based system and the increase in the award from £1,600 in the last financial year, is reflective of the costs of setting the database up and of increased lets/charges.
