1. Purpose of Report

Confirm details of a four year programme for the completion of Dundee's Play Area Refurbishments as agreed by this Committee on 20 March 2000 Agenda Item IX

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is recommended that the programme is approved in principle.
- 2.2 It is further recommended that the Director of Leisure & Parks is given the remit to complete detailed designs and costings and report back to subsequent Committees for approval for each phase.

3. Financial Implications

- 3.1 With reference to the Leisure Services Committee of 20 March 2000, Agenda Item IX the total cost for the removal of 46 play areas and the retention of 80 strategic play areas, of which 56 will be refurbished under this rationalisation programme is £1,500,000. The sum includes £349,600 for the removal and landscaping of the play areas and £1,150,400 for the refurbishment of those to remain. The current Leisure and Parks Department Capital budget includes provision for years 1-3 (2000/2001 2002/3).
- 3.3 The cost of design consultation and supervision will be met from the existing Leisure & Parks Department Revenue budgets.
- 3.4 The overall cost of maintaining the play areas will not be increased. Any additional costs will be offset by reductions where play areas have to be removed,

4. Local Agenda 21 Implications

- 4.1 The equipment that has been removed will be refurbished and re-used, where possible to improve other areas. The equipment and materials that are not re-used will be repaired for recycling. This will ensure that removal of the play areas does not create a problem of excessive disposal of materials and the environmental implications that would result.
- 4.2 All materials will be sourced from renewable resources where possible. It is proposed to install seats and litter bins made of recycled plastic. The safety surfacing used will also be of recycled materials.
- 4.3 The resulting areas, whether a play area has been removed or refurbished, will be an improvement to the environment of Dundee.

5. Equal Opportunities Implications

- 5.1 The refurbished play areas will be integrated as far as possible to ensure that people of all abilities will be able to access the facility and enjoy a fulfilling play environment along with their peers.
- 5.2 Facilities will be provided to interest children and young people of all ages.

- 5.3 All communities throughout Dundee will have access to high quality strategic play areas.
- 5.4 People living within areas affected by the Play Area Rationalisation proposals will be consulted before the details are finally decided upon.

6. Main Text

- 6.1 The Leisure Services Committee approved a remit on 16 August 1999 instructing the Director of Leisure & Parks to ensure that a survey into the condition of the Council's play areas would be reported to a Leisure Services Committee at the earliest possible time. Subsequently an extensive audit of the play areas of Dundee was undertaken. The Leisure Services Committee of 20 March 2000 agreed the Dundee Play Area Report 2000 in principle and the Leisure Services Committee of 21 August 2000 approved the detailed costs for the implementation of Phase I, which is now complete. Phase II is currently on site.
- 6.2 It is therefore recommended that the Committee agrees to the proposed programme and remits the Director of Leisure and Parks to bring forward tender reports for the works as part of the Department's Capital Programme. The final list will be determined by the detailed costs and will be the subject to further reports to Committee.

7. Consultations

- 7.1 Consultations have been undertaken with Elected Members in regard to the implications for their Wards with regard to the Dundee Play Area Refurbishment Programme.
- 7.2 Consultation has also been undertaken with Housing, Education, Environmental & Consumer Protection, Social Work and Economic Development Departments.
- 7.3 The Chief Executive, Director of Finance, Director of Support Services and Director of Corporate Planning have been consulted on the contents of this report.
