1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for the fabrication and installation of perimeter railings to the new Play Area at Baxter as part of the park's Restoration Plan.

2.0 RECOMMENDATION

The committee is recommended to:

- 2.1 Accept the quote of £21,235 from P&G Blacksmiths and Fabricators for the fabrication and installation of perimeter railings for the new Play Area at Baxter Park.
- 2.2 Approve a 5% contingency sum of £1,062 to be added to the project sum giving a total cost of £22,297.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The railings for the Play Area are part of Baxter Park Restoration Plan which is funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund, Historic Scotland and the Leisure and Communities Department.

The total cost of the Baxter Park Restoration project is £3,558,000 and will be funded as follows:

6.0 MAIN TEXT

- Reference is made to Report Number 392-2006 dated 20 June 2005 when the Committee approved the installation of a play area in Baxter Park.
- 6.1 The works comprise the installation of a perimeter fencing around the play area to provide a secure and safe environment for the users and the exclusion of dogs.
- 6.2 The four companies who were asked to submit a tender for the work were as follows:
