1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The report makes a recommendation for a grant award from the Equality & Diversity Grant Fund.

5.1 Grant assistance is awarded to groups which promote social inclusion and contribute to equalling opportunities within the City.

6.0 BACKGROUND

- At its meeting on 10 February 1997, the Committee approved the criteria and procedures for the Department's grant aid portfolio (Report No 127/1997 refers).
- 6.2 The Council has been approached by the Council of Ethnic Minority Voluntary Sector Organisations (CEMVO) to participate in a national UK based capacity building programme for minority voluntary organisations.
- 6.3 The programme costed at £2,000,000 nationally offers seconded business graduates plus central support to nominated voluntary organisations to improve capacity building partnership working and more effective/improved organisation development
- Dundee International Women's Centre, Bharatiya Ashram and Dundee Community Language Advisory Group have confirmed their willingness to become involved in this initiative.
- 6.5 The local costs for the participation of the above organisations is £6,450 plus the provision of office support services for the seconded personnel from CEMVO.
- 6.6 The initiative will last 1 year and offers opportunities for management accreditation of competences.
- 6.7 Each of the local organisations participating will benefit from the initiative and it will improve their capacity to participate in community planning and the activities of the new Dundee Equality & Diversity Partnership which has been approved previously by the Council and is due to gather for its first meeting in the Autumn of 2004.
