## 6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 The painting "Riders of the Sidhe" is one the City Collection's best known paintings. It is the work of Dundee born artist, John Duncan (1866 1945).
- 6.2 John Duncan studied at Dundee School of Art and later continued his studies in Antwerp and Dusseldorf. He was a member of the Dundee Graphic Arts association, shared a studio with George Dutch Davidson and was a close friend of Patrick Geddes, the sociologist and town planner. He was influenced as a young man by pre-Raphaelitism and studied Celtic and Norse legend becoming famous for his imaginative depictions of Celtic mythology.
- 6.3 The Riders of the Sidhe is one of his Celtic mystical paintings and shows a group of riders setting forth in a ritualistic procession carrying symbols of their faith and power.
- 6.4 The work is to be lent to the Bunkamura Museum of Art, Tokyo, Japan for the exhibition "From Pegasus to the Thoroughbred" from 2 September 22 October 2000.
- 6.5 The Bunkamura Museum of Art, built in 1989 is a multi purpose cultural facility and is one of the most prestigious venues in Toyko. It has the highest specifications of environmental control, fire protection and security systems. The work will be transported by national carriers, Constantine Ltd, as part of the whole exhibition and accompanied by couriers.
- 6.6 The work has been selected as the main image for the exhibition and will be used on exhibition posters, the catalogue cover and in advertising for the exhibition throughout Japan. Dundee City Council will be credited in all material connected with the exhibition.
