### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to advise Committee about plans to engage the Yusef Youth Initiative to conduct a scoping exercise with BME communities in Dundee to establish the Youth Work support needs for BME young people.

### 2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee approves plans to commission the Yusef Youth Initiative (Y.Y.I.) to carry out the scoping exercise.
- 2.2 It is recommended that Committee approves the payment of £5,000 to Y.Y.I. to enable the organisation to carry out this work.

## 3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 This expenditure can be met from the Leisure & Communities Department's 2010/11 Revenue Budget.

## 4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 Since 2005 Youth Workers in the Leisure and Communities Department have worked closely with the Yusef Youth Initiative to build cultural links between young people of different backgrounds in Dundee.
- 4.2 This cultural integration work has focussed very much on links with young Muslims in Dundee. It is recognised that there is a need to broaden involvement across all of the BME communities in Dundee.

#### 5.0 MAIN TEXT

- 5.1 This project is intended to establish contact with key communities, develop a network of contact and draft a strategy for engaging young people in BME communities in Dundee.
- 5.2 A key outcome for this project will be the development of support to enable BME young people to engage with the new Youth Council in Dundee.
- 5.3 The project will take place between October 2010 and March 2011 and the final report will be submitted by no later than the end of April 2011.

## 6.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS
