- The Youth Information Unit will continue to develop the provision of secondary school outreach support for young people and staff in the areas of Youth Information, Personal and Social Education and Citizenship within Integrated Community School joint working arrangements.

6.5 Young people will continue to receive support to develop ownership and an interactive relationship with the Dundee pages of the National Young Scot Website. This will be achieved through high contribution of news items, views and features about topics of interest to young people and Community Planning/Community Learning and Development partners.
