# 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

### 6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 The forthcoming exhibition, "McIntosh Patrick Remembered", will be shown at McManus Galleries from 25 November 2000 until 11 March 2001.
- 6.2 This small exhibition will focus on the City's permanent collection of McIntosh Patricks. Its purpose is to commemorate the late and great James McIntosh Patrick (1907 1998), Scotland's best-known landscape painter from the 20<sup>th</sup> century.
- 6.3 An important new acquisition will be one of the highlights of the show. In June 2000 the Arts & Heritage Department purchased an important early oil painting by McIntosh Patrick. "The Weaving Shed, Old Glamis Factory" was painted in 1929. Paintings of the interiors of textile mills are exceedingly rare. This work was commissioned by Donald Brothers, Dundee, whose firm produced a famous range of furnishing fabrics which were exported world wide.
- The outreach programme will include an illustrated talk surveying Patrick's entire artistic career.
