#### 6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 As part of the new design of the Bear Cage enclosure and also as a means of providing a better experience for visitors while maintaining an optimum environment for the animals, it is proposed that the lynx, wolf and arctic foxes enclosures are re-located to the south east corner of the Wildlife Centre. This will enable works to progress on the proposed new Bear Cage which will be reported to a subsequent Committee. In addition it will improve the balance of interest within the Wildlife Centre while at the same time ensuring that the habitat is optimised for the animals.
- 6.2 Quotations were sought from four Companies for the re-location of the enclosures. Dundee Contract Services and J B Corrie & Co Ltd declined to quote for the work. The following shows a break down of the two quotes received.

RBS Muir	£27,900
P & G Blacksmiths	£33,000
