6 BACKGROUND

6.1 Dangerous Building Notices

The City Engineer investigated 24 incidents relating to public safety of dangerous buildings during the month of August 2004. No formal Notices and Orders were issued under Section 13(1c) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

6.2 Direct Action Taken

Direct action has been taken and formal notices issued in one instance to ensure public safety is maintained under Section 13(1b) of the Building (Scotland) Act 1959.

6.2.1 <u>25 Mid Road</u> George Johnstone River Building 138 Nethergate Dundee - Collapsed chimney head. DCS secured the immediate area with hoarding.
