6.0 MAIN TEXT

- 6.1 The "Ban The Bottle The Life of Edwin Scrymgeour" exhibition will be at the McManus Galleries from 16 November 2001 to 6 January 2002. It is a small historical display of selected material from the Scrymgeour Papers collection of the Local Studies Department of the Central Library, together with artefacts from the museum collections of the Arts and Heritage Department.
- The exhibition will illustrate the life and career of Edwin Scrymgeour, a member of the early Labour movement in Dundee, founder of the Scottish Prohibitionist Party and Britain's only ever Prohibitionist MP (1922-1931).
- The display is mounted to coincide with the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Scottish Prohibition Party. There will also be a gallery lunchtime guided tour event on 29 November 2001. A leaflet about Edwin Scrymgeour will be produced to accompany the exhibition.
