#### 6.0 BACKGROUND

- 6.1 Developments in the use of SMARTCARD technology and the partnership between Dundee City Council and the University of Abertay, Dundee, have led to a seamless access path to library services. University of Abertay students can now use their SMARTCARD in the Council's libraries. Previously, students from the University of Abertay were required to produce a matriculation card and library staff would then issue a library card. The SMARTCARD technology now means that students can move seamlessly between University of Abertay and Dundee City Council's library services without being required to produce additional identity or hold more than one card.
- 6.2 Discussions have been taking place between Abertay University staff and Council staff over the past few months to explore the possibility of members of the City Council's libraries being able to borrow material from the University using their Discovery Card. Preparations are now underway to enable this facility to be introduced early in the New Year.
