6.1 Major Project Grants

Aims of the Scheme

- To increase provision of good quality, best value, services in the cultural sector in Dundee
- To promote social inclusion through sector activity
- To assist non-profit organisations undertake the delivery of arts and heritage projects in Dundee
- To complement the Leisure and Arts Department's priorities and public programme

Assessment Criteria

- The extent to which the aims of the Application meet the Aims of the Scheme
- The relevance of the application to the delivery of quality leisure and arts services in

Dundee

- The expected impact of Council support on the applicant organisation's ability to deliver leisure and arts services in Dundee
- Evidence of sound organisational and financial management
- Production of a balanced project budget eligible costs up to the sum applied for.

Small Projects Grants

Aims of the Scheme

- To assist non-profit organisations undertake short-term leisure and arts projects in Dundee
- To complement the Leisure and Arts Department's priorities and public programme

Assessment Criteria

- The extent to which the project increases public access to leisure and arts opportunities
- The extent to which the project complements, or adds to, already existing provision
- The impact of Council support on the viability of the project
- Evidence of ability to deliver the project, with sound organisational and financial management
- Production of a balanced project budget.
- 6.2 The Projector Animation Festival is produced and directed by Susie Wilson in partnership with Scottish Screen, Scottish Enterprise Tayside, City of Discovery Campaign, Dundee University, University of Abertay, Dundee College, Dundee Contemporary Arts and Dundee City Council Leisure and Arts Department. The week long event will take place at Dundee Contemporary Arts from the 15 to 21 November 2003.
- 6.3 The total cost of the project is £27,700. The Leisure and Arts contribution would be £2,000. A copy of the total budget is enclosed (Appendix A)
- 6.4 Projector will be a week-long event with screenings showcasing the best animated films from around the world, along with masterclasses and workshops where the attendees will learn from industry professionals and debate on how to translate strong ideas into commercial success.

The aims of the project are threefold:

- 1) To inspire the audience with the films screened, and with the words of the speakers.
- To enable the audience, by stimulating their creativity and deepening their understanding of the business and technological issues particular to the industry, to attain their own success.
- To strengthen the links between individuals, companies and sectors in the Scottish animation industry, with the ultimate aim of consolidating its reputation on the world stage.
- 6.5 The initiative intends to involve Professionals from animation production companies creating short films, specials, features, series for television, 3D animation, effects and titles; from web design companies, games companies, interactive and multimedia content creators. Students of animation will also be invited. Expected turnout is 160 people for Thursday 20 and Friday 21 November; while the 6 public screenings of animated feature films are expected to attract a total audience of 300.

Thursday 20 November

Two workshop sessions where attendees can learn about acting for animators from Ed Hooks; a hands-on day putting the theory into practice.

Friday 21 November

The core Projector day, as outlined in previous partnership meetings, will mirror the format of the past two sell-out years. There will be two screenings of short films, a special programme of Iranian animation and two masterclasses. The day will close with a networking party for all speakers, attendees and sponsors.
