Dundee International Women's Centre	Dundee International Women's Centre is a charitable organisation, working with women, parcticularly those from minority ethnic communities, on their personal development and social inclusion through a programme of social, educational and cultural events. The Cultural and Collaborative Art is a 6-month project aimed at young women (12-21 yrs. old) from the ethnic communities who do not traditionally have access to mainstream youth provision. The aims of the project are 1) explore the contemporary experiences and understanding of being a young woman in Dundee with a particular view to explore ideas of belonging and cultural identity, and 2) an end of project exhibition of a range of art work developed by the young people.
