1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

To outline the savings proposal in relation the Equality & Diversity Fund and seek approval to implement this change from 1 April 2025.

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

Committee is asked to approve the removal of the Equality & Diversity Fund at the end of the current financial year.

3.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This would result in a saving of £6,000 per year from 1 April 2025.

4.0 BACKGROUND

- 4.1 The purpose of the Equality & Diversity Grant Fund is to directly support Dundee City Council's Mainstreaming Equalities Agenda and meet our Legal General Duty to pay due regard to the need to eliminate discrimination, advance equality of opportunity and promote good relations across the range of protected characteristics (age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy & maternity race, religion or belief, sex and sexual orientation).
- 4.2 The fund was re-launched in 2021, as a new 'Community Based' Equality Small Grant Fund. Applications up to £1,000 are considered, with an average grant of £500 being awarded. This fund is specifically targeted towards supporting up to 12 local community groups each year. Provision of the funding can also support the Council to build meaningful partnerships and relationships with local community groups.
- 4.3 As part of the Budget Consultation views were sought regarding this discretionary expenditure. There were 2807 responses in relation to this option with the average impact rating suggested as low (2.22/5.0). More detailed narrative feedback was received from 511 people and common themes included.
 - a large proportion stated that the removal of this fund would not personally affect them;
 - a smaller number recognised its importance for others, with many highlighting that cutting
 these grants would have a detrimental impact on vulnerable communities, including
 minority groups and small charities that rely on this funding for cultural and inclusion events;
 - overall, the impact of this saving would be lower than many of the other options put forward.
- 4.4 Ceasing this funding would not stop the range of activities that go on in the City and Dundee City Council officers can signpost or support local community groups to identify and make applications to other local and national funders.
- 4.5 In support of meeting our equality duties, the Council will continue to take other relevant actions through the development and implementation of forthcoming Equality Mainstreaming Report 2025-2029.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report has been subject to an Integrated Impact Assessment to identify impacts on Equality & Diversity, Fairness & Poverty, Environment and Corporate Risk. An impact, positive or negative, on one or more of these issues was identified and is noted within Appendix 1. An appropriate senior manager has checked and agreed with this assessment. From the 2807 responses to the Equality Funding question in the recent Council Budget Consultation Survey, over 500 people went on to give further detailed responses around the effects of ending this fund.

There were a number of comments suggesting that the savings from cutting these grants are minimal compared to their significant positive impact on the community, some criticised council for considering the cut given the small amount of money involved and its potential benefits. Some respondents argued that the Council has a moral duty to support equalities and there was also concerns raised that small charities, which are already struggling, will be adversely affected by the proposed cuts.
