1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

This report is to inform the Elected Members on the Revenues Division's Counter Fraud activity as at 31 December 2014

2.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

4.0 MAIN TEXT

Counter-fraud performance and comparison data for the previous year is detailed on the attached appendix and the main highlights are summarised below.

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The number of Benefit Fraud case closures, which have resulted in a guilty verdict, have decreased in comparison to the previous year, from 21 to 11. This is mainly due to the team now investigating Corporate Fraud referrals as well as benefit cases.

- The local joint counter-fraud initiative with the DWP has now ceased. Results from this pilot are now starting to show in the team's overpayments totals, which have increased from £496,527 to £663,978.
- As of January 2015 the team are back operating with its maximum 3 Fraud Officers due to the investigative completion of the DWP Initiative.
- The Fraud Team have achieved significant successful outcomes for non-benefit fraud case referrals.

5.0 POLICY IMPLICATIONS

This report has been screened for any policy implications in respect of Sustainability, Strategic Environmental Assessment, Anti-Poverty, Equality Impact Assessment and Risk Management.

There are certain areas of benefit spending where local authorities have scope to monitor and control costs and for such cases, subsidy is paid at a reduced rate. Where Housing benefit overpayment has been classified as fraud or claimant error, then the local authority receive subsidy to the value of 40% of these overpayments. The local authority will also endeavour to recover in full, from the claimant, the overpaid benefit.
