1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To seek approval for Dundee Contract Services to undertake improvements to Dawson Park including the parks entrance, signage and railings.

2 **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 It is recommended that the offer from Dundee Contract Services for improvement works to Dawson Park of £43,500 inclusive of contingencies be accepted as fair and reasonable.

3 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

3.1 The cost of £43,500 can be met from the provision in 2002/2003 Leisure and Arts Department Capital Estimates for Playgrounds/Parks Improvements.

6.1 The proposed refurbishment works to the entrance of Dawson Park are designed to provide a welcoming and user friendly first impression to the park. This is seen as the first phase of a programme of works to make improvements to the city's parks. Replacement planting is proposed to the entrance road along with new railings and low walls. Trip rails and delineation of car parking bays with one space for disabled drivers are also proposed. Display cases will provide visitors with the layout of the park and forthcoming events within the park. 6.2 It is recommended that the Committee accept the offer from Dundee Contract Services of £43,500 as being fair and reasonable and advantageous to the City Council.
