1.1 To seek approval to carry out essential maintenance & refurbishment work to monitoring boreholes at Riverside Landfill Site

6.0 MAIN TEXT

In 2000 a Ground Investigation of Riverside Landfill Site was undertaken by Messrs Ritchies on behalf of the Council. This involved the installation of a large number of boreholes to provide for the on-going monitoring of gas, leachate and groundwater movement on the site. Prior to 1996, 17 boreholes were originally installed for monitoring purposes. These boreholes now require to be permanently identified and repaired to bring them in line with those installed in 2000 thus ensuring the accuracy of the data collected.

The monitoring data collected is required to form the design of the final capping proposals to the satisfaction of the Scottish Environmental Protection Agency(SEPA).

To ensure that the monitoring regime functions efficiently, regular maintenance and refurbishment work requires to be undertaken. Having installed the original wells, it is considered that Messrs Ritchies are best placed to undertake these works.
