Location

Dryburgh Industrial lies adjacent to the Kingsway (A90), with direct access to Dundee's outer ring road connecting the City to Aberdeen, Edinburgh and Glasgow and beyond. Occupiers include Tesco Customer Contact Centre and Royal Mail.

Description

- The subject comprise an end terraced industrial unit forming part of a terrace of four units of traditional steel portal frame construction with profiled metal cladding, under a pitched corrugated roof.

- The unit has a solid concrete floor, blockwork walls with profiled metal cladding above, and pitched roofs incorporating 10% translucent roof panels supplemented by suspended sodium and strip light fitments. Vehicle loading access is by way of a steel concertina door to the front elevation and the accommodation benefits from a minimum eaves height of 5.75 metres.
- There is parking for approximately 40 cars on the forecourt to the front of the premises.
