#### 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 This report outlines proposed funding allocations to a number of cultural organisations for the financial year 2019/2020.

### 2. RECOMMENDATIONS

- 2.1 It is recommended that Committee:
  - (i) approves the allocations of funding to the organisations set out in section 4.5 for 2019/2020;
  - (ii) remits the Chief Executive to explore how we increase destination marketing with this sector as a priority.

#### 3. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 3.1 For financial year 2019/2020 it is proposed to allocate grants amounting to £1,011,000. These proposals represent a saving of £60,471, equating to a 6% reduction in funding compared to 2018/2019.
- 3.2 The council has developed a bespoke grant and in-kind package for each of these key cultural bodies over the years, consequently the savings being proposed reflect the individual circumstances facing each partner organisation at the present time.

## 4. MAIN TEXT

- 4.1 Cultural organisations are valued partners in the city, supporting the delivery of our strategic priorities to improve outcomes for our citizens. They enrich the lives of citizens, contribute to the vibrancy of the city and provide valuable learning experiences and community outreach, particularly for young people.
- 4.2 Many of these organisations have received grant funding for some time and in these challenging financial times a more strategic approach is needed to assess and reach longer-term funding decisions.
- 4.3 A meeting of the Policy and Resources Committee of June 2018 agreed the Changing for the Future Programme C2022. This outlined the work programme for 2018/2022 with a project included under the Service Design theme headed Cultural Sector. This project's high level scope is to undertake a review of the cultural sector across Dundee and relevant strategic partnerships to ensure the sector continues to offer robust and sustainable cultural services.
- 4.4 Some discussions with these organisations have highlighted that there is expertise and experience that could work with other city partners to drive forward this project. A recent discussion highlighted the following areas for particular focus:

- (a) more joined up pro-active approach to city messaging and destination marketing
- (b) collective look at shared services, efficiency savings and income generation
- € taking advice from cultural sectors in other UK cities who have tackled the above
- (d) working more strategically with the commercial and business sector to support this work
- € more efficient partnerships across the City in terms of service delivery
- Whilst this review was not agreed as a priority project last year, we will look to explore how this review can be commenced as soon as possible, particularly work in relation to (a) above as this could generate more visitors to the city and ultimately generate more revenue for these organisations going forward and reduce reliance on Council core funding. Given the importance of tourism on the City's economy we are creating a city marketing budget of £100,000 within the Chief Executive's budget to support this work.
- 4.6 Given the financial pressures on the Council, the proposed reductions are a reasonable and responsible approach to balancing the Council's own budget challenges. We will work with each organisation to ensure the proposed funds for 2019/2020 are released in instalments and frequencies that support these organisations to implement any operational changes reducing the risk to each organisations in the short-term and providing adequate time to fully discuss future options.
- 4.7 The table below details the current total funding levels, proposed reduction and the proposed total funding for 2019/2020:
