

How do I apply to vote by proxy?

- 1 You must ask someone if they are willing and able to be your proxy and vote on your behalf. Please note that a person can only be the proxy for close relatives and up to two other people at the referendum on independence for Scotland.
- 2 Unless you are registered to vote as a service voter, you may need an appropriate person to sign your application. See notes overleaf for information on who can support your application and when this is required.
- 3 Make sure **you** complete all sections of the form and supply your date of birth and signature.
- 4 Return your form to your local electoral registration office. You can find their details at www.aboutmyvote.co.uk

Please do not return your form to the Electoral Commission. Please note: this form can only be used after 5pm on Wednesday 3 September 2014 and must arrive at your electoral registration office before 5pm on Thursday 18 September 2014.

This form can only be used for the referendum on independence for Scotland.





Voting by proxy

If you are not able to attend the polling station in person for reasons relating to your occupation, service or employment, and you only become aware of this after 5pm on Wednesday 3 September 2014, you can apply to vote by emergency proxy (someone else voting on your behalf). You can apply up until 5pm on Thursday 18 September 2014.

This form should not be used if an order has been made against you under Sections 53, 54, 57(2) (a) or (b), 57A(2) or 58 of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995, or if a direction has been made against you under Section 136 of the Mental Health (Care and Treatment) (Scotland) Act or section 59A of the Criminal Procedure (Scotland) Act 1995.

Who can support my application?

If you are applying for a proxy vote before Thursday 11 September 2014, you do not need to have your application supported.

However, if you are applying for a proxy vote on or after Thursday 11 September 2014, your application must be supported.

"I'm self-employed, who can support my application?"

A person aged 18 years or over who knows you and is not your spouse, civil partner, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, child or grandchild.

"I'm employed, who can support my application?"

Your employer or another authorised person at your workplace.

"I am registered as a service voter, who can support my application?"

You do not need support for your application if either:

- You are a member of the Armed Forces, a Crown Servant or a British Council employee and are registered as a service voter.
- Your spouse or civil partner is a member of the Armed Forces, a Crown Servant or a British Council employee and you are registered as a service voter.
- You will be 16 or 17 on 18 September 2014, your parent or guardian is a member of the Armed and Forces, a Crown Servant or a British

Council employee and you are registered as a service voter.

If you are registered as an ordinary elector, you will need support from your employer or another authorised person at your workplace.

What happens after I've returned this form?

- Your proxy must go to your polling station to vote on your behalf.
- You should tell your proxy which referendum outcome you want them to vote for on your behalf.
- Your local election office will tell your proxy when and where to vote on your behalf.
- You will need to give your date of birth and signature on this application form. This information is needed to prevent fraud. If you are unable to sign this form, please contact your Electoral Registration Officer.

Voting as proxy

A person can only be a proxy for close relatives and up to two other people at the referendum.

Close relatives are the spouse, civil partner, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, child or grandchild of the applicant.

The proxy does not need to be registered to vote in the referendum but must be 16 or over on 18 September 2014 and must be a British, Irish, other European Union or qualifying Commonwealth citizen.
