1.	<p>Welcome & Introductions</p> <p>Glyn welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were given</p>	
2.	<p>Previous Minutes</p> <p>Previous minutes were agreed as a true and accurate record.</p>	
3.	<p>Matters Arising</p> <p><u>Community Safety – Ardler Community</u></p> <p>Police Scotland gave an update regarding their response to issues in Ardler of anti-social behaviour amongst some young people in the evening. Joint work has taken place with DCC Anti-Social Behaviour Team, CLD Youth Work, DCC Community Safety Wardens, Xplore Dundee (Buses) Sanctuary Housing.</p> <p>Anti-Social Behaviour Team, Police Scotland and Xplore Dundee to work jointly to deliver sessions on Bus safety in Primary Schools across the city. This includes five primary schools in Strathmartine, Craigowl, Sidlawview, Downfield, Ardler and St Andrews Primary Schools.</p> <p><u>Building Stronger Communities – Locality Leadership Sub Group</u></p> <p>The Building Stronger Communities meetings will be replaced by Locality Leadership Subgroup. The Strathmartine LCPP will nominate community reps to attend. This can be on a rotational basis. Locality Leadership Subgroup meetings will take place after LCPP meetings and before the Locality Leadership meetings chaired by Greg Colgan.</p>	

Mel Kiyani will represent the Strathmartine LCPP at the first meeting to be held on the 25th of June.

Firework Control Zones

Gillian Lamb updated the LCPP on the prospect of an area of Kirkton being considered as a Firework Control Zone. However, having looked at recorded incidents around the misuse of fireworks, this is not a high priority area of the city.

4. **What Matters to You Data – Kerstin Jorna / Geoff Leask**

Kerstin presented data she has been gathering on behalf of What Matters to You. The data was themed around criminal justice, household income / universal credit and health. Discussion around need for a more targeted approach to ensure support for young people with parents in the criminal justice system. A targeted approach could also apply to support around household's who are struggling financially.

5. **Summer Holiday Provision – Keiran Drugan / Holly Aitken**

In the west of the city, Dundee Carers and Leisure & Culture are co-ordinating summer activities funded through the Whole Family Wellbeing Fund. Activities / provision to cater to whole families to address any barriers. Also keen to avoid duplication. This includes transition work with pupils in P7 moving to secondary education. This will involve School & Family Development workers in Primary schools. Active school's co-ordinators will be involved in offering sporting activities throughout the summer holidays.

Local community groups, CLD Youth Work are also planning a programme of summer activities in Strathmartine.

There will also be an interactive map which will allow parents / carers to see what is on in their area over the summer holidays. This is being led by Children and Families.

6. **Strathmartine Local Community Plan Update**

Mark gave an update on progress with the Strathmartine Local Community Plan. This will be shared with the partnership along with the minute. The partners then split into two groupings. Each group had a ten-minute discussion around any gaps in priorities. Feedback from these discussions were then shared around the table.

It was agreed that we should move from the existing five priority areas and streamline them to three priority areas:

We need to improve spaces, places and transportation in Strathmartine to better meet the needs of the community.

We need to improve local supports for people around mental health and recovery.

We need to target support for families and children in need across Strathmartine to improve life chances.
